PABC By-Laws

DEACONS

Term of Service

Normal Deacon terms are for three years and run from date to date as shall be determined by the church. An active deacon may not serve more than 3 consecutive years unless it is necessary to fill an incomplete term or there are fewer deacons than are necessary to perform the duties and functions of the deacon committee. In either of these circumstances nomination and election are required.


Proposed change to "Term of Service" verbiage.

Ordained deacons who have expressed willingness and ability will serve on an as-required basis for an indefinite period. Those on the active list will be on a rotation for Offertory Prayer, and other duties including, but not limited to, Lord's Supper, Benevolence offering, new member and hospital visits will be delegated on an as-needed basis.

Nomination and Election Procedure.

Nomination for new, non-ordained members will proceed on a yearly basis and will adhere to the existing procedure.

October's Business Meeting will also begin the 2020 Budget Process. Your attendance and input is needed and appreciated.

What to put in my shoebox


Start with a quality "wow" item such as a stuffed animal, soccer ball with pump, or clothing outfit that will capture the child's attention the instant he or she opens the box.
