Oh give thanks to the Lord; call upon His name; make known His deeds among the peoples!

Psalm 105:1

Gratitude is. a powerful emotion for believers to achieve and maintain. Harvard Health Publishing re-released an article in June from 2011 where researchers had concluded that those who practice gratitude are more optimistic than others and make fewer trips to the doctor. In their study the group that did best were those who took time each week to write down things they were grateful to have.

Of course, November is a time we set aside for thanksgiving, to remember God's provision, protection and blessings over the past year. Over the last few years a challenge has become popular on social media, like Facebook, to post each day for 30 days something in your life for which you are thankful. I would encourage you to take the challenge.

God is so good and the practice of recording things for which we are grateful can make us even more aware of His presence and grace. I hope you keep a daily prayer journal. As I write this note, I looked and counted 33 journals I have kept through the years. Make sure that as you make each day's entry that you start with the things for which you are grateful. It will change your life.

### **Questions on Giving**

Three big principles of any solid financial plan are to save, spend and give. Most people forget about the giving part, though, because they think mostly about saving and spending.

But giving—specifically tithing—is just as important. It softens the heart of the giver and frees their soul from dependence on money. You'll never walk away from giving feeling bad! Giving comes in many forms, with your tithe being the most important, because it's a biblical mandate.

#### What is a tithe?

Let's start with the basics. Simply put, the tithe is the first 10% of your income that should be given to your local church. It's strictly measured in money, so you can't replace it with giving your time or your talents.

### What does the Bible say about tithing?

According to Leviticus 27:30 (TLB), "A tenth of the produce of the land, whether grain or fruit, is the Lord's, and is holy." And 2 Corinthians 9:7 (NIV) says, "Each of you should give what you have decided in your heart to give, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver."

### What's the difference between tithing and offerings?

A tithe is an amount (a percentage of your income) and an offering is anything given beyond that, but not in place of the tithe.

### Why should I tithe?

Tithing was created for *our* benefit. It teaches us how to keep God first in our lives and how to live unselfishly. Unselfish people make better spouses, friends, relatives, employees and employers. And they usually have better finances. God is trying to teach us how to prosper over time.






Christians often tell us they wish their holidays could be centered on more than just sharing a meal together, but they just aren't sure how to do so.


There are many helpful tools online to develop our spiritual disciplines. Make this November a true time of thanksgiving to God.




